DEFINITE DEREGISTRATION

COMPULSORILY, deregistrations will be submitted and processed at the CAT (Authorised Treatment Centre. List of centres available on www.dgt.es).

This formality cannot be conducted at Provincial and Local Traffic Departments except for the definite deregistration of vintage or historic vehicles, vehicles of value to collectors or intended for museums. In these cases, only for citizens and their representatives. Companies and groups obliged to interact electronically with the Administration, as well as their representatives, must make the request by electronic means.

The documentation to be submitted at the CAT is:

- **Application form** provided by the CAT.
- **Identification of the applicant:**
 - Natural persons: official document accrediting his/her identity and address (Id card, Spanish driving licence, residence card, passport plus Foreigner Identification Number).
 - Legal persons: tax identification card and proof of the representation and identity of the person signing the application. (*Model available on www.dgt.es*).
 - Minors or disabled persons: data and signature of the father, mother or guardian, his/her ID card and document accrediting their relationship.
- **Vehicle documentation:** registration certificate and roadworthiness certificate or affidavit of loss or police report in case of theft of the vehicle documents.
- The existence of an **administrative immobilization on the vehicle** is an impediment to deregister the vehicle; it needs first to be cancelled.
- **Agricultural vehicles will be required to provide** a document proving they have been deregistered in the Official Register of Agricultural Machinery of the Autonomous Community.

In the case of **cars or vehicles assimilated to cars, or trucks or vans up to 3.5 tonnes, or vehicles with three symmetrically arranged wheels fitted with an engine having a cylinder capacity of more than 50 cm³**, the CAT will be responsible for the destruction of the vehicle and for issuing the certificate of destruction.

As for the remaining types of vehicles, to which Royal Decree 20/2017 of 20 January on end-of life vehicles does not apply compulsorily, the CAT will issue the environmental treatment certificate.

In any case, the CAT will be responsible for recording the deregistration process online in the DGT Registry of Vehicles and will deliver proof of the definite deregistration at the Registry of Vehicles to the applicant.

This proof will serve as accreditation to any Administration that your vehicle has been deregistered at DGT Registry of Vehicles. In addition, this document has a verification system that allows the applicant to verify its authenticity online.

NOTE: *If the formality is conducted by a person other than the owner of the vehicle, a written and signed authorisation to act on his/her behalf must be submitted; the authorisation shall state that this representation is free of charge (model available on www.dgt.es).*

If any of the data required above cannot be clearly proven, additional documentation could be requested.
